### **Home Groups**

Home Groups will be launching in the Benefice this September. Those of you who have previously been involved in such groups will know that Home Groups are an important part of nurturing a church community, they keep the fire of faith burning between Sundays and therefore raise the spiritual temperature that we start from on a Sunday.

The groups will meet weekly at a time to suit the group members and each group would have 6-8 people. The groups can use the time to discuss that week's sermon, for prayer and fellowship.

Home Groups need a leader and a host, this may be the same person or it may be two people who pair up to run a Home Group. Hospitality (Gospeltality!) is a key part of this; however it doesn't need to take place in someone's home. Zoom could also be used to help accessibility for a group - although that does make offering coffee and cake slightly harder!

## **A Week at Windsor**

I have just returned from one of the most challenging, stretching and affirming courses that I have ever encountered.

The Windsor Leadership Trust (WLT) has its roots in St George's House, Windsor which has now been immortalised by episode 7, season 3 of The Crown on Netflix where the Duke of Edinburgh and Dean Robin Wood start a process to "effect change for the better in our society by nurturing wisdom through dialogue". From this WLT was created to focus on the top levels of leadership as the need for exceptional leadership to tackle the big issues in society become apparent.

The Emerging Strategic Leaders programme is set for leaders who have the potential, ability and ambition to reach influential strategic leadership positions within the next 5-10 years. The WLT carefully selects each cadre so that the Civil Service, Military, Corporate, Charitable, Faith and Public Sectors are all represented. This diversity was key, to hear the challenges of other sectors was eye opening, but seeing the commonality in our challenges was strangely assuring. For example, some sectors had enormous old buildings that caused them all sort of headaches and were difficult to work in – as you can imagine I had empathy with that situation!

Jane Burgess, Civil Service Commissioner

The location was such a joy, the history all around us was inspiring. I was able to attend Mattins in St George's Chapel sitting in the Quire and one evening we were invited to Evensong. It was wonderful to see how many people from the course chose to attend, the Gospel was John 15 and the next day I slipped in a tiny reflection on pruning, with my syndicate group. We also had a 10pm private tour of St George's where we were able to see things that are not normally open to the public. I asked why the tour was so late - it all hinges on the Organist who has priority every day until 10pm.

It has been an incredible experience, I have come away with an action plan for me, for the next six months. In October we meet again in Cumberland Lodge to report back on our progress and to be held accountable. This is just as well, it will take me months to process all I have seen, heard and encountered. I now join 4,000 alumni of the WLT which is a mix of Senior Leaders across the globe, the Alumni network also provides continuing professional development opportunities.

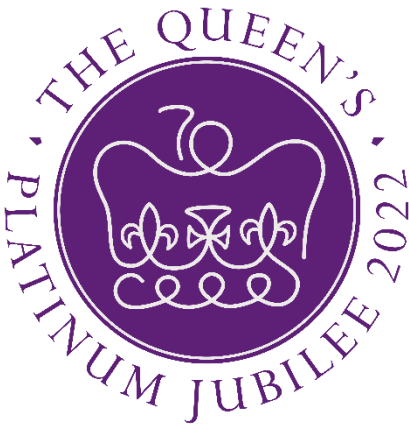
